

Please allow this letter to introduce you to The Ryan Goldblatt Foundation. Ryan Goldblatt lost his courageous two and a half year battle with AT/RT (brain cancer) on September 15, 2010. He was almost 4 years old. Although cancer never defined Ryan, cancer did invade his brilliant brain and stole him from this earth. Ryan never let cancer get in the way of life. He enjoyed living each moment of his young life to the fullest. He would never sit around and sulk and feel sorry for himself. Perhaps his age had something to do with this—he was 16 months old when he was diagnosed with cancer. The cancer world was his life—he didn't know anything different. When he passed away, it was our responsibility to make sure Ryan's memory would not be forgotten. We knew we would establish a foundation in his memory to help find a cure for this ugly disease. The Ryan Goldblatt Foundation was born.

Four months after Ryan passed away, Lois Goldblatt, Ryan's grandmother, died unexpectedly from heart disease. Ryan and Lois were very close and loved spending time together. Ryan's other grandmother, Barbara Wilpon, passed away in 2021 from complications of COVID. Ryan adored both of his grandmothers so much and it brings us comfort to know that Ryan and his grandmothers are together and are proud of our efforts to not only keep their memories alive but to give back to all of the organizations that have helped us throughout our fight.

The Ryan Goldblatt Foundation (EIN 45-5398217) is a 501 (c)(3) public charitable organization. The mission of the Ryan Goldblatt Foundation is to raise money for the medical institutions and charitable organizations that provided support and services to Ryan and his family during his fight with cancer.
